

Center City Council June 6, 2016

Regular meeting of the Center City Council was called to order by Sandy Olin at 7:00 pm at the Betty Hagel Memorial Civic Center. Present were council members JD Hanson, Dallas Morast, Eric Casson, City Attorney John Mahoney, and Auditor Terrie Nehring.

Morast moved to approve the April minutes. Seconded by Hanson, roll vote, all voting aye, motion carried.

Hanson moved to approve the minutes from previous meeting. Seconded by Morast, roll vote, all voting aye motion passed.

Old Business:

Discussion on City wide cleanup was discussed. See if county would like to join for a county wide cleanup. Their responsibility would be ½.

New Business:

Casson moved to approve the Pheasants forever gaming application, seconded by Hanson. Roll voting, all voting aye, motion passed.

Roof leak discussion. John Clarys will be contacted for an estimate of racquet ball court. Bradco Restoration could potentially fix the caulking on the roof.

Clerk position was briefly discussed. Will be left until new council is in place.

Center welcome baskets were presented to the council. Olin stated to find some sort of object labeled with the City of Center to add to the community welcome baskets, not to exceed \$200.

Isaak work truck damage was discussed. Letting employee drive it home from work was discussed. Concerns of damage from hitting birds/deer in the additional miles was discussed. Council asked if parking it at the city shop is a proper solution without increasing the risk of accident. Auditor will consult with Isaak and present response at next meeting.

Request of use of City loader for the demolition was discussed. Morast moved that the City pay loader can be used for the demolition derby under the pretenses a county/state/city heavy equipment operator operates the loader at all times. Seconded by Casson, roll vote, all voting aye, motion passed.

Terrie Nehring requested the use of the Civic Center parking lot as a possible parking if needed for over flow of trailers for the Cans of Coal Barrel Race. Council granted request.

Office hours on Friday were discussed. Council decided they wanted the office open Friday the 10th of June from 8-3. Mrs. Hammers will be asked if she can come in from 8-3 to file and answer phones during that time due to Old Settlers.
